2006 Sky Channel Topgun

Nation's top sprinters line up to decide Topgun

A star-studded field for the 2006 Group 1 Sky Channel Topgun was announced at Sandown Park on Thursday night.

Boasting five Group 1 winners and 10 Group-race titles, the final field of eight has won a combined total of 136 races, and prizemoney in excess of \$875,000.

Drawing the all-important red box was track specialist Fenceline. A winner of 12 races at the Lightwood Road circuit, he has been freshened up since finishing fifth in his semi final of the Group 1 Paws Of Thunder, and is sure to be in peak condition come next Thursday's final.

The only Sky Channel Topgun finalist to race at Sandown Park on Thursday night was Jaimandy Coops, who impressed all with a scintillating 8.75 length win in a slick best of night run of 29.72 in his Schweppes Melbourne Cup Prelude.

Despite drawing the awkward box five for the final, Paul Donohue's exciting sprinter is sure to be in the reckoning in the final

The only interstate greyhound to make the field was Group 1 National Derby winner Brother Knows. The black speedster has won both of his starts at Sandown Park, and sounded an ominous warning to his rivals when an impressive third in the G1 Paws Of Thunder at his last start.

Since its inception in 1993, the Sky Channel Topgun has become one of the most sought after events in Australian greyhound racing. With champions including Rapid Journey (1998), Bombastic Shiraz (2003), Whisky Assassin (2004) and Black Enforcer (2005) among its past winners, it's little wonder the Sky Channel Topgun is regarded as the Cox Plate of greyhound racing.

The \$179,000 G1 Sky Channel Topgun will be run at Sandown Park on Thursday 26 October 2006.

Top Gun Timeline

1993 First Top Gun run. Victorian champions Worth Backing and Golden Currency defy wet and cold conditions to finish in a dead heat. Revealing finished a further four inches away in third. Worth Backing and Golden Currency split the \$40,000 winner's purse.

- 1994** Topgun held at Olympic Park. Winner's purse increased to \$50,000.
- 1995** Rapid Hiker sets new track record on old Sandown Park track.
- 1996** First place prizemoney increased to \$70,000.
- 1997** Greyhounds from Ireland, the UK and United States compete against Australia's best.
- 1998** Race elevated to Group 2 status.
- 2000** Prizemoney increased to \$100,000 to the winner.
- 2003** Bombastic Shiraz completes Triple Crown – claiming the Shootout, Melbourne Cup and Topgun.
- 2004** Whisky Assassin, drawn favourably in box 8, sets new Sandown Park track record – 29.40 seconds.
- 2005** Prizemoney increased to \$125,000 to the winner.
